It was well attended, a good time had and new friends made. We raised just under  $\pounds 200$  on the day. A further  $\pounds 60$  was given after the Sunday service by people who couldn't come on the day. When I rang my brother to tell him that the amount had increased to  $\pounds 260$  he generously made it up to  $\pounds 300$  pounds.

With the aims being met we will be running our next Fun Coffee Morning on 16th of January .The cakes will be provided by Lydia, who supports Brain Tumour Research and our church generously will provide the hall etc and beverages as our part of community outreach and support.

## **Grounds - Peter**

Firstly my thanks to the following, Harry for keeping the Hedges tidy and clipped. Josie for the flower displays in the wall tub's and concrete containers either side of the entrance door. Arthur for the spring summer bulb and annual flower displays in the two wooden and large concrete containers by the entrance to the hall and by the gate. Jonathan for keeping all the plants watered during the year. Chris for taking on the Memorial garden, clearing and planting. Barrie and Jennie for the lavender plants in the border under the clock and for the flowers in the containers on the trellis.

In an effort to make the grounds more manageable and bindweed free, to the left of the pond all plants have been dug up, soil dug over and bindweed roots cleared, two bags filled: the area to be grassed. To the right of the pond ground that has been cleared of weeds, replanted with saved perennials. The top section of the north facing border, all plants and shrubs have been taken out and the bindweed, this will be turned to grass. The thorny Pyracantha bushes which had become very large and unmanageable have been taken out. All grassed areas have been regularly mowed.

As in the new year the garden waste 12 bags are to be replaced with just one wheelie bin, less garden waste will be needed.

Adopting a planter, flowerbed or border, pulling out the odd weed or deadheading can help the Team and maintain the recognition of the Walmer in Bloom judges.

#### Hire of Premises - Janet

Once again 2023 saw our suite of rooms being used regularly by our own functions and those of our community, including keep-fit, Living Lively (singing for the over 50's) and the Rosamond Club. The poetry writing group continue to use the lounge fortnightly, along with the gentleman who continues to use the lounge regularly for 1-1 counselling. Deal Music & Arts used the hall in October for a music workshop, which proved successful. The hire of premises has proved a good source of income for the fellowship.
